MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING, DECEMBER 9th, 2025

1. CALL TO ORDER: Chair Pennisi called the meeting to order at 7:11 PM. Committee members Pennisi and Ritchey were present. Committee members Cantú-Reyna and Wais were absent. Quorum is not achieved.
2. CALL FOR REQUESTS TO CONSIDER ITEMS OUT OF ORDER: None.
3. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS: None.
4. LAW ENFORCEMENT ISSUES AND REPORTS
 - a. REPORT FROM RESIDENT DEPUTY CASTILLO: The typical report did not generate correctly, so we do not have the number of calls to service and the number of reports. November of select crimes (2 for the month) included 1 assault with a deadly weapon and one petty theft from a vehicle. Deputy Castillo announced that as of January 12th, 2026, he will no longer be the Resident Deputy for Crockett, and his successor will be Deputy Handel, who was also in attendance.
 - b. REPORT FROM CHP ON TRAFFIC ISSUES: Not in attendance.
 - c. NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: None.
5. ADMINISTRATIVE:
 - a. ELECTION OF OFFICERS: No vote can be completed due to attendance.
 - b. UPDATE ON LPRS (LICENSE PLATE READERS): No new information.
 - c. DISCUSSION ON PROACTIVE CRIME DETERRENDS: Resident mentions that reviving neighborhood watch groups would be an excellent crime deterrent and suggests that an effort be made to reestablish these groups. Deputy Handel announced that recently with the holidays, there has been an uptick in package thefts, and everyone should be vigilant. There was a discussion on neighborhood watches potentially becoming obsolete due to personal home security systems and apps like NextDoor. Committee member Ritchey suggested rumble strips as a deterrent for sideshows. He provided information on the potential solution, which is attached to the minutes.
