CROCKETT SANITARY COMMISSION - Since its formation in 2006, the Crockett Sanitary Department has been overseen by a five-member Sanitary Commission that oversees sewer service in the town of Crockett, appointed by the District Board to serve two-year terms. Commissioners **must reside within Crockett**. They receive no compensation. In the performance of its duties, the Crockett Sanitary Commission has the authority to set policy, make and enforce regulations, regulate sewer use and construction, charge for services, incur expenses, and enter into contracts. **Meetings are held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 4:00 pm in the Crockett Community Center.**

PORT COSTA SANITARY COMMISSION - Since its formation in 2006, the Port Costa Sanitary Department has been overseen by a five-member Sanitary Commission that oversees sewer service in the town of Port Costa, appointed by the District Board to serve two-year terms. In the performance of its duties, the Port Costa Sanitary Commission has the authority to set policy, make and enforce regulations, regulate sewer use and construction, charge for services, incur expenses, and enter into contracts. Commissioners **must reside within Port Costa**. They receive no compensation. **Meetings are held on the 1st Tuesday of each month at 6:00 pm in the Port Costa School, 1 Plaza Del Hambre, Port Costa, CA.**

RECREATION COMMISSION - Since its formation in 2006, the Recreation Department has been overseen by a seven-member Recreation Commission that oversees recreation service in the towns of Crockett and for Port Costa, appointed by the District Board to serve two-year terms. Commissioners **must reside within Crockett or Port Costa**. They receive no compensation. **Meetings are held on the 1st Monday of each month at 6:00 pm in the Crockett Community Center.**

LIGHTING AND LANDSCAPE COMMISSION – Established in 2023, the L&L Department is overseen by a five-member L&L Commission that oversees certain lighting and landscaping services in the town of Crockett, appointed by the District Board to serve two-year terms. Commissioners must reside within Crockett. They receive no compensation. In the performance of its duties, the L&L Commission has the authority to set policy, maintain lighting and landscaping maintenance, charge for services, incur expenses, and enter into contracts. **Meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Crockett Community Center.**

CROCKETT POLICE LIAISON COMMITTEE – Crockett's local resource for voicing concerns on non-emergency matters, including parking enforcement. The Police Liaison Committee advises the County Sheriff and CHP on law enforcement issues and expenditures in Crockett. Committee members **must reside within Crockett**. They receive no compensation. **Meetings are held on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Crockett Community Center.**
