MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING, MAY 13, 2025

1. CALL TO ORDER: Chair Pennisi called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Committee members Pennisi, Wais, Cantu-Reyna, and Ritchey were present.
2. CALL FOR REQUESTS TO CONSIDER ITEMS OUT OF ORDER: None.
3. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS:
 - 3.1. A resident requested an update on what is being done to address sideshows. Committee member Wais informed the resident that this issue is high on the Supervisor's priority list. It was also mentioned that action was taken in a recent sideshow occurrence, seven people were arrested between Vallejo and Crockett. A roundabout is not a feasible option. Deputy Castillo stated that he spoke with Public Works regarding a roundabout, and they do not believe this is a practical option. Other preventative options are being considered.
4. LAW ENFORCEMENT ISSUES AND REPORTS
 - 4.1. REPORT FROM RESIDENT DEPUTY CASTILLO: In April, there were 6 selected crimes, 3 residential burglaries, 1 undetermined if crime was committed (item was missing), 1 stolen package, and 1 other burglary. There was 1 stolen vehicle recovered. There were 20 reports and 274 calls to service. Committee member Cantu-Reyna inquired about the bike thief who was previously brought up. Deputy Castillo said that the city of Hercules had a warrant for him, but he fled town.
 - 4.2. REPORT FROM CHP ON TRAFFIC ISSUES: Not in attendance.
 - 4.3. NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: None.
5. ADMINISTRATIVE:
 - 5.1. UPDATE ON LPRS (LICENSE PLATE READERS): Chair Pennisi noted that the grant application was presented to the Crockett Community Foundation (CCF). The vote will take place on June 5, 2025. That meeting will take place in Port Costa.
 - 5.2. DISCUSSION ON PROACTIVE CRIME DETERRENDS: There was a discussion on homeless people camping in town. It was brought up that there was a tent in the downtown plaza. Deputy Castillo visited the site multiple times, and no person returned. The tent was disposed of. The state is planning on enforcing a no encampment over 3 days policy. Crockett is a low-risk spot, because there are not many resources. In cities like San Francisco, or LA free food, charge locations and even checks (spending money) are provided to homeless. Crockett does not offer the same amenities. There are expected to be more efforts around clearing encampments in neighboring areas, but this requires consistency to be effective.
 - 5.3. REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS: None.
6. CONSENT CALENDAR: Committee Member Wais requested that the minutes be removed from the consent calendar due to errors. The hazardous spill location was incorrect, and the name John Angell was misspelled. Committee Member Cantu Reyna also mentioned that her name was misspelled in the footer.

A motion to approve the modified consent calendar (abbreviated CCSD Board Actions Summary from April 23 and April 28, 2025, only), as presented, passed. (Wais 1st, Cantu-Reyna 2nd, 4/0). A motion to approve the CPLC minutes as corrected for the April 8th, 2025, meeting with edits as noted earlier passed. (Ritchey 1st, Wais 2nd 4/0).

7. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS: No change requested from the current agenda
8. ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at 7:24 PM until June 10, 2025.
