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MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING, NOVEMBER 10, 2025

1. CALL TO ORDER: Chair Pennisi called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Committee members Pennisi, Wais, Cantú-Reyna, and Ritchey were present.
2. CALL FOR REQUESTS TO CONSIDER ITEMS OUT OF ORDER: None.
3. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS: There was an inquiry regarding why the eastbound I-80 on-ramp is frequently closed. Deputy Castillo did not have a specific reason and primarily cites this to maintenance. He also provided notice that Caltrans will be completing work on that on-ramp/bridge and will continue to have closures of the ramp and entire bridge.
4. LAW ENFORCEMENT ISSUES AND REPORTS
 - a. REPORT FROM RESIDENT DEPUTY CASTILLO: For October, there were 248 calls to service, which generated 27 reports. Reports included arrests, vehicle pursuits, minor thefts, suspicious activity, and vehicle tows. The Pursuit occurred near San Pablo Ave and Cummings Skyway. There were 3 select crimes: 1 domestic violence incident resulting in injury, 1 grand theft from a vehicle, and 1 petty theft from a vehicle. It was asked if sidsnows appear in the reports, and they do not, because those are the jurisdiction of CHP and would not show up in the reports from the Sheriff's Department.
 - b. REPORT FROM CHP ON TRAFFIC ISSUES: Not in attendance.
 - c. NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: None.
5. ADMINISTRATIVE:
 - a. UPDATE ON LPRS (LICENSE PLATE READERS): Jena Goodman (General Manager-GM) provided the LPR update. Before the meeting, there was a round table with the County Supervisor to discuss sidsnows. The group believes that the LPRs are a great idea and an effective deterrent. Caltrans confirmed that LPRs can be put on Caltrans-owned polls, with an encroachment permit. Since the CSD does not have a plan to maintain these cameras long-term, Ms. Goodman will be pushing to have the County sign the contract and facilitate the project. Since the cameras fall under traffic enforcement, CHP will need to confirm that they will use the system before initiating the service. This will be followed up on at the next round table discussion. Beyond LPRs, alternative solutions were discussed. A roundabout was specifically reviewed and deemed infeasible due to truck traffic. Rearranging the intersection would be reviewed, where a diamond split could be added. The potential of adding ordinances for participants and spectators will be examined.
 - b. DISCUSSION ON PROACTIVE CRIME DETERRENTS: Keep your garages and sheds closed and locked. A resident pointed out that streetlights are a good deterrent, but notices that there are some that are no longer functioning. The resident was directed to report the lights if they still do not work.
 - c. APPROVE MEETING SCHEDULE FOR 2026: All Committee Members agreed to the proposed schedule.
