

**RESOLUTION
NO. 22/23-21**

WHEREAS, The voters residing within the boundaries of the Crockett Community Services District did vote to approve Measure L, thereby adopting the Measure L Initiative Ordinance 'Enacting a Special Tax on Properties Located in the Crockett Zone of the District To Fund Maintenance of Public Outdoor Spaces and Amenities', for town Maintenance and landscaping activities as set forth in ordinance(the "maintenance special tax"); and

WHEREAS, The maintenance special tax, an initiative brought forth by citizens of the District, was approved on November 8, 2022, by a majority of the voters residing the District boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 04-22 of the Local Area Agency Formation Commission provides that The Crockett Community Services District is authorized to continue to levy and collect general taxes, fees, charges, assessments and other revenues; and

WHEREAS, in approving the adoption of the maintenance special tax ordinance the voters did specifically authorize the district to collect this tax in the manner and for the purpose described in the abovementioned ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the ordinance mandates that it "will be approved if a majority of the voters voting on the measure vote in favor of it";

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the District Board of the Crockett Community Services District does hereby recognize the will of the voters and does adopt the Measure L Initiative Ordinance that was approved by a majority of the electorate of the District; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Manager is instructed to prepare the special tax levy in accordance with the provisions of the Measure L Initiative Ordinance and to take all actions necessary to collect the tax each year in the amount levied by the Board in accordance with the ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Manager is to manage the funds collected by the maintenance special tax in such a way as best applies the funds for the uses described in the Measure L Initiative Ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the reasonable costs incurred by the County officers collecting and administering this tax shall be deducted from the collected taxes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the chief fiscal officer of the District shall file a report with the Board of Directors of the District no later than January 1 of each year pursuant to Government Code Section 50075.3; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any legal challenge to this resolution or to the maintenance special tax adopted by this resolution shall be brought as provided in Government Code section 50077.5.

THE FOREGOING RESOLUTION was adopted at the Regular Meeting of the District held on February 22, 2023 by the following vote and shall be effective immediately:

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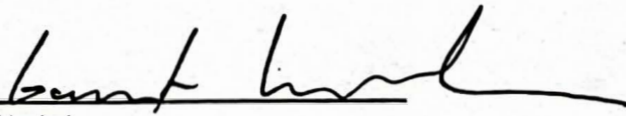
